Hi James,

I've attached the supplemental plan describing Skagit River tribal spring Chinook fisheries that occur this April and early May, such that we are in accordance with last year's 2020-21 LOAF. As described in the document, the Swinomish Tribe is scheduled to begin fishing the week of April 25<sup>th</sup>, and the Upper Skagit Tribe starts the week of May 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Sauk-Suiattle Tribe does not open their fisheries until the week of May 16<sup>th</sup>, by which time a 2021-22 BiOp should be in place, so they are unaffected by the need for this document.

Although a final preseason FRAM run has not yet been made, I've attached the last North of Falcon run from PFMC showing that we are below the 10.3% SUS CERC with these fisheries. A final TAMM input was provided by the Swinomish and Upper Skagit tribes for a C&S spring Chinook quota after this model was run, so I've added that C&S change to the attached model such that all impacts are accounted for, still showing that we are below 10.3%.

As this is the first time providing such a document, please let us know if there is additional information you need or have any questions.
