We'll probably start on Saturday (assuming coverage is available by then) and fish into next week. We'll adjust the duration of the fishery such that we're not expected to exceed the pre-	
season modeled wild impacts,	so I'd expect it to run less than 4 days given the later timing. I can send you the atch projections as soon as soon our fish committee finalizes firms up plans.
Lorraine wanted me to check with you to make sure NOAA is ok with adjusting the fishery to this later time. There is language in the LOAF regarding schedule changes. Would NOAA have any issues with this, assuming our projected impacts remain within what was modeled pre-season?
