Dan and Joan: Attached is a chart showing known remaining derelict nets as of today by sub-basin. I used the sub-basins as described by Puget Sound Nearshore Ecosystem Restoration Project. Also included is an excel file with the remaining net data.

As we continue with our current surveys we will be finding more net targets, in shallow water. I would estimate that in the San Juan and Juan de Fuca basins, there will probably be another 25% more net targets. In the Whidbey, N.Central, S.Central, Hood Canal and South Sound the totals will probably be about twice the number that we have now.

Hi Joan,

We are working to finalize our critical habitat designation for listed rockfish, and I have some old information in some of our documents regarding the estimated remaining derelict nets in the 5 basins of the Puget Sound.

Here's an example:

"The highest concentration of derelict fishing nets in the DPSs remain here, including over 100 nets in waters deeper than 100 ft (30.5 m) (NRC, 2010), and an estimated 705 nets in waters shallower than 100 ft (30.5 m) (Northwest Straits Initiative, 2011)"

Is there an easy way for me to find estimates for the remaining nets in the San Juan, Whidbey Basin, Main basin, Hood Canal, and South Sound?
